Camper Eligibility Checklist

- Prospective Camper is age 6-17.
- Prospective Camper experienced the human death of someone significant/close to them.
- Prospective Camper can recall memories of time and/or activities, they spent with their person who died.
- For new campers: the death occurred at least 3 months before, AND within the past 3 years, of the camp session they wish to attend.
 - If your camper attended Camp Erin At Home 2020: the death of their person may occur within the past 4 years of the camp session they attend.
- I understand that to assure Camp Erin LA is an appropriate fit for my child/teen, the application process includes:
 - A review of Prospective Camper's written application
 - A phone screening
 - A Camper & Family Interview *via Zoom*

Acceptance to camp is contingent upon completion of the Zoom Camper & Family Interview.
- I understand that space is limited, and applications are reviewed on a first come, first serve basis. Priority acceptance may be given to parental and sibling deaths. Due to the large number of applicants Camp Erin LA receives each year, and the need in the community, campers are invited to participate in a Camp Erin LA session for a maximum of two consecutive summers.
- I understand it takes 2-3 weeks from the date I submit the application before I will be contacted.
- A guardian of the camper is willing and able to participate in their own programming (provided by OUR HOUSE staff and volunteers) during the camp experience and remain present at the campsite for the duration of the camp day.
