Program Highlights

CHILDREN & FAMILIES

Families

In September, we launched our **Family Support Program** after five years of development. It is a family-centered, best practices approach to grief support in which children and guardians attend grief support in their own rooms on the same night after enjoying a pizza dinner together. While children engage with their peers in newly expanded, 12-session grief support groups, their accompanying adults are encouraged to participate in clinician-led psychoeducational workshops. These sessions address the unique challenges of parenting a grieving child, provide insights into the art projects and activities happening in the children's groups, and foster connections among parents/guardians who share the experience of loss.



“
Now I'm able to just be at ease and express that [my mom died] and I can navigate other people's feelings about the grief and be fine with it. It just made me feel really, really safe and cared for. It's just really nice to have the community of support there.”

Students

During the 2022-2023 year, the **School Program** provided free school-based grief support to grieving students at 53 schools across Los Angeles County, delivering an evidence-based curriculum that promotes healing through peer support and connectivity within their own school community. Direct school outreach provides support to children whose caregivers may lack transportation and other resources.



Campers

Since 2009, OUR HOUSE has been the Los Angeles partner for **Camp Erin**, the largest nationwide network of free bereavement camps designed for children and teens ages 6-17. At Camp Erin LA, campers engage in memorializing art projects and grief expression exercises in addition to fun camp activities to release stress. Camp Erin LA creates space for campers to openly discuss the death, enrich their emotional vocabulary, and normalize their responses to grief within a supportive peer group.

In 2021, OUR HOUSE launched a day camp model that includes a parallel Adult Camp for campers' "Grown-ups". The camp sessions in September 2023, August 2022, and June 2022 were day camps. In June 2023, we had our first three-day, weekend camp session since 2019. The Adult Camp presented a unique opportunity for caregivers to learn about parenting a grieving child and explore their own grief feelings among peers.



“Meeting other kids at camp that are going through that same pain as you are makes you not feel alone. Right? Like it gives you a sense of like, okay, I’m not the only person in the world going through what I’m going through.”



Program Highlights

ADULTS

“Everybody I’ve met, whether they’re staff at OUR HOUSE or alumni or a volunteer, everybody just has these huge warm hearts that have nothing but love and are just so giving. That’s why they’ve lasted this long: the love and the giving.”

English

The **Adult Program** provides grief support groups at our centers in West Los Angeles and Woodland Hills. Groups are age and relationship specific and provide respite for individuals as they navigate their journey towards healing and hope. Members often stay in touch when groups end because of the strong connections created during their time together. They are also invited to join the OUR HOUSE Alumni Program, which offers opportunities for alumni to stay engaged with each other and OUR HOUSE.





Spanish

Formerly known as the Spanish Satellite Program, the **Spanish Community Program** provides free, culturally sensitive grief support groups and workshops in Spanish. The program increases access to grief resources in Spanish across Los Angeles County and recognizes the unique burdens and struggles of the Latinx grief experience. In 2023, OUR HOUSE focused our expansion efforts on the South Bay, aligned with a \$150,000 grant from Providence Little Company of Mary - San Pedro Medical Center.

It was absolutely life changing and I would not have been able to get through that first year. I had some difficult dark times, especially in the months before the group started, because I didn't have any coping skills except to just shove it down or suck it up. **OUR HOUSE will give you a home and it will give you a safe spot to talk about your grief.** It will give you people who get it like you will find your people and it will be magical. And these people will likely be in your life for a very long time.

Online

Building on the success of our COVID-19 response, we expanded our **Limited Virtual Program** to serve adult grievers who cannot travel to our centers due to geography, transportation challenges, and work or childcare schedules. This program increases accessibility and provides more options for grievers to choose their own path toward hope and healing.

30TH ANNIVERSARY

The Return of the Walk 'n' Run for Hope!

After four years, the Walk 'n' Run for Hope returned! At a new location in Woodley Park, more than 1,100 people attended the event to honor the people in their lives that died. Participants enjoyed a live performance by multi-platinum singer/songwriter Andy Grammer, danced to a mariachi band along the route, and enjoyed other activities in the festival zone.



30th Anniversary House of Hope Gala

300 people gathered to honor our founder and guiding light, Jo-Ann Lautman. Comedian Marc Maron brought the laughs while accepting his Good Grief Award. We also bestowed two new awards, the Journey of Hope Alumni Award to alum Leslie Yabuki and the Community of Hope Award to Cedars-Sinai. Special guest Joe Williams, lead singer of the band TOTO, performed the hit song "I'll Be Over You."

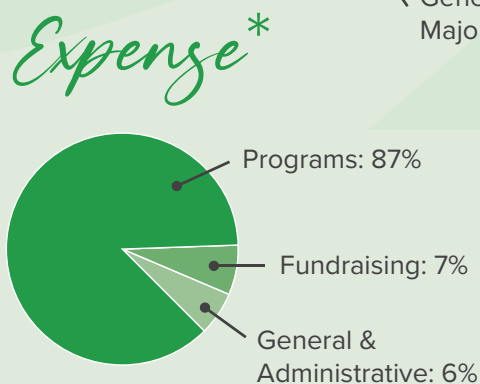
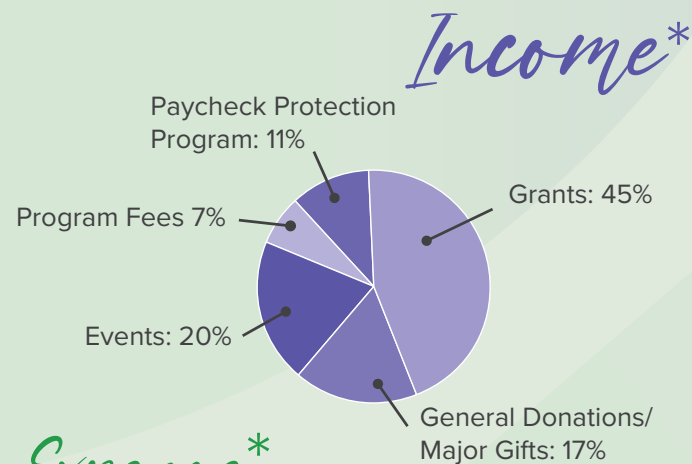

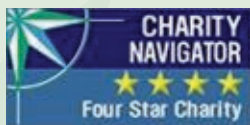
OUR HOUSE operates on a high-impact, low-cost model that maximizes your investment in our grief support programs. **87% of your dollar goes directly to programs.**
